**PUBLIC HEARING ON DELAWARE COUNTY'S
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT NEEDS**

JULY 23, 2025

The Delaware County Board of Supervisors held a public hearing to hear comments on Delaware County's community development needs and to discuss the possible submission of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for the 2025-26 program year. The hearing was held in the Board of Supervisors' Room of the Senator Charles D. Cook County Office Building, 111 Main Street, Delhi, New York, at 1:00 p.m. on Wednesday, July 23, 2025, Chairman Tina B. Molé presiding.

Chairman Molé called the hearing to order and read the notice of public hearing:

Delaware County will hold a public hearing on July 23, 2025, at 1:00 p.m. at 111 Main Street, Delhi, NY for the purpose of hearing public comments on Delaware County's community development needs, and to discuss the possible submission of a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) application for the 2025-26 program year. The CDBG program is administered by the New York State Office of Community Renewal (OCR), and will make available to eligible local governments, approximately \$40M for the current program year, with the principal purpose of benefiting low/moderate income persons. Delaware County is applying for \$300,000 to establish a micro enterprise program. The hearing will allow for citizen participation in the development of a proposed grant application and/or alternate proposals. Public comments on the CDBG program or proposed project will be received at this time.

The hearing location is accessible to persons with disabilities. If special accommodations are needed, those individuals should contact Tabitha Byam at tabitha.byam@co.delaware.ny.us at least one week in advance of the hearing date to allow for necessary arrangements. Written comments may also be submitted to Tabitha Byam until July 25, 2025.
